I'm Becoming the Person I Want to Be

Todd Corvin, 46, describes his childhood home as abusive and violent. After graduating from high school, Todd joined the military. Though



he developed a taste for alcohol there, he appreciated the structure and routine of military life. "The military kept me alive," he says, "but once I was back out in the wide world again, I didn't know how to deal with it."

Struggling to cope as a civilian, Todd turned to alcohol and drugs, often lashing out in anger when things didn't go his way. By the time he came to Star Gospel Mission in September

2021, he'd been homeless several times.

Right away, Todd sensed that the staff at Star Gospel Mission really wanted to help. "It's a good environment, orderly and clean," he says. Daily drug tests helped hold Todd accountable in his addiction recovery. Church, Bible studies and talks with the staff gave him comfort and new ways to think.

One time, Todd relapsed and returned to the Mission beaten and discouraged. "I told Pastor Marion, 'This is what I do. This is my life," Todd recalls. "Pastor said, 'It doesn't have to be your life.' I realized I had to look at myself in a different way. I can be the person I want to be."

Today, Todd has a full-time job and is looking to the future with hope and purpose. "I could have left the Mission when I got my first

paycheck, but I knew I'd go back to my old ways. Now, my anger is nonexistent—I've learned to take a breath and step back.

My alcoholism isn't a thing anymore. Star

As we develop a strategic plan for the next three to five years, the Mission and its leadership are exploring solutions to the lack of affordable housing in our area.

Our Transformative Programs and Services

SGM DORM

Our resident program provides men with overnight shelter for six months or more. Guests of our 22-bed stability shelter also have access to case management.

WORSHIP PROGRAMS

Guests attend onsite Sunday worship services centering on the words and ways of Jesus of Nazareth. Those who cannot attend Sunday worship can participate in "Bible & Biscuits," our inductive Bible study, each Friday morning.

BIBLICAL COUNSELING

Each guest receives counseling sessions to address his brokenness and pursue redemption and reconciliation with God, their families, and their community.

CELEBRATE RECOVERY*

Guests take part in onsite meetings and journey together through the 12 steps of Christ-centered recovery.

ACE OVERCOMERS*

Guests can take part in weekly meetings addressing adverse childhood experiences and how to heal from them.

FINANCIAL LITERACY CLASSES

Through a partnership with Pinnacle Financial, guests can attend classes that help get their finances back on track.

FAMILY EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE AND OUTREACH

Families in Charleston, Berkeley, and Dorchester counties receive help from our social services team throughout the year, along with gift cards during the holiday season through the Good Cheer Fund.
